



How to Enroll in Access Gallery Programs:

Access Gallery serves people with disabilities who are interested in creative, educational, social and economic opportunities through the visual arts. We primarily serve individuals who are eligible for Program Approved Services Agency (PASA) based services. For those who are not PASA eligible, admission is determined on a case-by-case basis. Individuals that are interested in participating in our various community art based programs can begin the process by contacting their case worker who then can contact our Programs Coordinator at 303-777-0797 or email at cris@accessgallery.org to set up an initial tour of the Gallery. After the tour, if you are interested in participating in one of our programs, we ask that you fill out an application and attend an interview. Upon acceptance, the first three months of enrollment are a trial period. This gives an opportunity to fully integrate into the programs and determine if one is a good fit. Upon a positive completion of the trial period, we will meet to talk about establishing your personal goals, as they relate to your work at Access Gallery.

The process outlined above relates generally to participation in our Open Studio, Community Arts and Respite programs. Some of the programs have additional requirements or follow different procedures, as described below.

ArtWorks:

After a minimum of three months in our programs, artists who have shown a commitment to building the skills and experiences necessary to be a successful visual arts entrepreneur may be selected to become ArtWorks Artists. We have a limited number of spaces available for ArtWorks Artists, so artists who have demonstrated the appropriate level of commitment may be placed on a waitlist until space is available.

Programs:

Summer Job Development Program:

The summer program primarily serves students with disabilities who are eligible for participation in the School to Work Alliance Program (SWAP). Interested students should contact their case manager at their school.

Access Gallery Shows and Openings:

The majority of our shows are produced by artists in our programs. From time to time, we feature the work of artists from outside our programs, but we are not currently seeking such artwork.
